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Chair's Report - 2012/13

It is with great pleasure that I present to you the 2012/13 (3rd) Annual Report of the ARONAH.

The work of the board and subcommittees for the financial year 2012/13 have again largely focussed on achieving key goals articulated in our strategic plan. The key focus was on the opening of the ARONAH to members from the 1st July 2013.

To achieve this very significant milestone, an enormous amount of work was required by the educational and practice standards committee members and by board members. These included

- The drafting and ratification of standards, codes, guidelines requirements, and grandparenting documents.
- Extensive consultation of the same and revision based on this consultation.
- Development of board policies on consultation processes, conflict of interest, donations and notifications processes.
- Website and database development

ARONAH continues to receive frequent correspondence from practitioners both domestic and increasingly, international practitioners, wanting to register with ARONAH or be added to our mailing list, from students asking for advice regarding their current or future potential course of study to the public wanting recommendation or referral to well qualified practitioners.

ARONAH received four complaints from the public regarding a practitioner which was referred to their professional associations and state health care complaints commissions as appropriate.

ARONAH also received responses from every Federal, State and Territory Health Minister acknowledging our letter highlighting

• the report - *The Practice and Regulatory Requirements of Naturopathy and Western Herbal Medicine (2005)* be brought to the Australian Health Minister's Advisory Council for consideration



• A copy of the report regarding the **regulatory options for unregistered health professionals** also be considered by the AHMAC as a matter of urgent priority.

Due to a call for nominations for the election of 3 practitioner board positions in NSW, QLD and VIC and 3 community members made in June of 2012, the board welcomed Jackie Arbuckle (VIC) and Amie Steel (QLD) as practitioner members and Eloise Archer (SA), John Cooper (QLD) and Karen Malcolm (QLD) as community members. The energy and effort of the new board members has been hugely welcomed and indeed have largely contributed to ARONAH being ready to accept members from the 1st of July 2013.

I would like to thank the board, the subcommittee members and our administrator for their generous provision of the many hours of voluntary work required to keep ARONAH progressing. Again without them ARONAH ceases to function.
